There is no opportunity to reschedule a test date if you fail to register and complete the test on one of the currently available test dates. All dates are listed on the CASPer™ website.***

Admissions

Admission to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Scholar Practitioner Program (SPP) is limited. Admission consideration is based on the following criteria:

- A recognized undergraduate degree with a minimum overall average of 75% (calculated on the best 10 full course equivalents not including transfer courses out of the first 25 full course equivalents completed). Applicants with final degrees containing less than 10 full course equivalents will not be considered.
- Successful completion of one (1) course in anatomy and one (1) course in physiology (or one (1) course in anatomy and physiology combined) and one (1) course in general psychology at the university level from a recognized institution. ***Transcripts submitted at time of application must show all courses required for admission consideration either completed or in progress. This includes the prerequisite courses of anatomy and physiology and general psychology. If these courses are in progress a transcript must be submitted by the document deadline indicating that you are registered for the course. Declaring in progress courses on the Course Summary Requirement Form is not sufficient.***

Applicants who have completed courses not listed and wish to have them evaluated for equivalency should contact the Admissions Office at admissions@nipissingu.ca. We recommend that prospective applicants send their request prior to submitting an application.
- CASPer™ assessment

Applicants must hold a recognized undergraduate degree, have completed all prerequisite courses and be able to provide a final transcript indicating that the degree has been conferred by **June 30, 2022** in order to be eligible to apply. The degree must be conferred no later than **Spring 2022** Convocation.

Transcripts

Official transcripts are required from all post-secondary institutions (college and university) attended, including transcripts from institutions attended on exchange and Letter of Permission (even if courses are incomplete and grades do not appear on the transcript). Transcripts submitted at time of application must show all courses required for admission consideration either completed or in progress. It is your responsibility to ensure that all courses (completed or in progress) appear on your transcript that is sent by your institution. All transcripts must be received by **4:30 pm EST on February 8, 2022**. When ordering your transcript please keep this date in mind. Choose an option that will ensure that we receive your transcript by the deadline.

Nipissing University transcripts need not be submitted, however, if you attended Nipissing University prior to 1992 you are considered a Laurentian University student and you must submit that transcript. If you have completed courses outside of North America you must have all your foreign transcripts evaluated and translated by World Education Services (WES): www.wes.org/ca. A WES Credential Evaluation Report, including a Course-By-Course Analysis, must be sent directly to Nipissing University by **4:30 pm EST on February 8, 2022**. Applicants are responsible for the costs associated with the WES evaluation and any translation required. Note that it can take upwards of six weeks for WES to receive official transcripts from a foreign academic institution, after which point the WES evaluation can take a week or longer to complete. Applicants should begin the evaluation process as early as possible.

All transcripts received by the document deadline will be reviewed. If anything is determined to be incorrect or incomplete it will be rejected. If this happens too close to the document deadline to allow for a re-submission of revised documents then you will not be considered for admission to the program. There are no exceptions for late submissions.

Applicants must declare and submit transcripts for all postsecondary institutions attended regardless of whether it is relevant to your undergraduate degree or not. Failure to declare may result in your application being rejected. If discovered after an offer of admission is issued the offer may be revoked.

English Language Proficiency

Applicants whose first language is not English may be required to supply proof of proficiency in English. Among other options, acceptable proof of English proficiency includes the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), International English Language Test Service (IELTS), the Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic, Canadian Academic English Language (CAEL/CAEL Online) or Cambridge English Qualifications. CASPer™ Assessment

All applicants are required to complete the online CASPer™ (Computer-Based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics) assessment. CASPer™ is an online test which assesses for non-cognitive skills and interpersonal characteristics that Nipissing believes are important for successful students and graduates of the Scholar Practitioner program.

In order to take CASPer™, applicants will be responsible for securing access to a computer with audio capabilities, a webcam, and a reliable internet connection on the selected test date. CASPer™ can be taken practically anywhere that you can satisfy the aforementioned requirements. No exceptions will be provided for applicants unable to take CASPer™ online due to being located at sites where internet is not dependable due to technical or political factors.

To schedule your CASPer™ test, visit www.takealtus.com and register using your OUAC Reference number. You will be provided with a limited number of testing dates and times. Please note that these are the only testing dates available for your CASPer™ test. There will be no additional tests scheduled. Please use an email address that you check regularly; there may be updates to the test schedule. ***We do not require you to have written the test by the application/document deadline. You can choose to write on any of the available test dates. However, it is recommended that you register for a test date by the document deadline. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that they are aware of all available test dates. There is no opportunity to reschedule a test date if you fail to register and complete the test on one of the currently available test dates. All dates are listed on the CASPer™ website.*** Please direct any inquiries about the test to CASPer™. There is both an FAQ section and chat function available on their website. The CASPer™ test is comprised of 12 sections of video-based or word-based scenarios. Following each scenario, you will be required to answer a set of 3 probing questions under a time limit. No studying is required for CASPer™, although you may want to familiarize yourself with the test structure at www.takealtus.com, and ensure you have a quiet environment to take the test.
